Pupil Acceptable Use Policy

Both Whiteshill Primary School and Whiteshill parents have a duty of care to protect children and ensure that the internet use of our pupils is responsible and safe. Unmonitored social networking is not supported in our school and we recommend parents carefully monitor how children interact with others online at home, including their friends and peers.

Each year, during Anti-bullying week in February, we work with StaySafe Workshops and the Gloucestershire Constabulary Schoolbeat to educate the children on how to keep themselves safe online. This is then followed up during assembly throughout the year with the support of www.thinkuknow.co.uk school resources and videos.

Pupils at Whiteshill Primary School agree to always follow these rules in school to ensure they are kept safe online:

I must ask an adult before I do any of the following: use the internet, use a computer or iPad, enter a games website, download anything.

I must show respect for the following:

Work done by others, folders or files belonging to other people, computing equipment, other users.

I will not give out any of my personal details online, including the school's details, my name, home address, age or

The school can look at my computer files and my internet history and if I am found to break these rules I could be stopped from using the Internet or computing equipment in school.

I must not use a mobile phone or any other computing device from home in school and can only bring one in to the school building with permission from the Headteacher.

If I see anything online or get sent anything that makes me unhappy I will tell a trusted adult within the school immediately and close or lock the screen if I do not wish to look at it.

I will only use the username and password given me by the teacher and will not share it with anyone else.

I will only use computing equipment and the Internet in school to carry out the task that I have been asked to complete by the teacher.
