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## Good Luck Miss Middleton!

Today is Miss Middleton's last day before her maternity leave begins on Monday. We can't believe that she won't be with us from Monday – we will miss her terribly as a friend and colleague but we are also incredibly excited to meet her little girl when she arrives! We will keep you updated when the news comes, as I know many of you are just as over the moon for her as we are!

As you know, Mrs McKay will be teaching in Oak class from Monday which is really wonderful for the children as she is an established member of our teaching team and she knows the year 6 children in particular so well. They also met Mrs Johnson yesterday who will be working with them in the afternoons on Tuesday, Wednesday and Thursday.

## Willow and Elm Class Visits and Parents Evening

This week we invited the parents in Willow class in to come and see the classroom and the school as they were unable to come in to the school before they chose us for their children last year. If you were not able to make these visits, please do ask and we will see if we can find a time that is convenient for you to come up to class at some point. I managed to show some of the parents around the rest of the school but didn't catch you all, so again, please do grab me at the end of a school day if your child is in Willow class and you would like to come and see the hall and library etc. and the rest of the school grounds at any point.

Next week, we would like to give Elm class parents chance to pop in and see their new classroom and meet Mrs Porter and Mrs Colman as again, the year 1 children in particular have not had a normal journey through school so far and have had very little opportunity to come inside. It will also give you chance to see the classroom which Mrs Porter and Mrs Colman have worked hard on over the summer and ask any questions you might have about the transition in to Elm class. We will be holding two informal drop-in sessions after school next week – you do not need to book, you can just come on in. One on Tuesday 12<sup>th</sup> October and one on Thursday 14<sup>th</sup> October at 3.30pm approximately. Once all the children have been safely returned to their parents on the playground at the end of the school day, you will be able to come back up in to the classroom together to have a look around. Your children can show you around their favourite areas of the classroom and the teachers will be there to chat and answer questions. Please wait in the playground with your children until we are ready for you to come back up in to school.

During the second half of the autumn term we will hold parents evening and this will be in person for the first time in nearly two years! So for those parents of children in Maple and Oak class, this will give you an opportunity to see inside their new classrooms and meet their new teachers one on one. Letters will go out about parents evening before half term.

You should have received an email earlier in the week alerting you specifically to two jobs that we have available at the moment which may be of interest to a parent or family member. We are looking for someone to cover Miss Kiddle's maternity leave with breakfast club and also a new permanent midday supervisor. If you know in advance that your child is going to be absent from school for a register session e.g. morning or afternoon or more, you need to fill in a leave of absence request form. These are kept in the lobby area at the front of the office so you can go in and get one at any time. The form has a letter on the reverse which explains the absence policy. I have attached to this newsletter a blank copy so that you can take a look if you are interested. This is a standard form that all schools in Gloucestershire use.
