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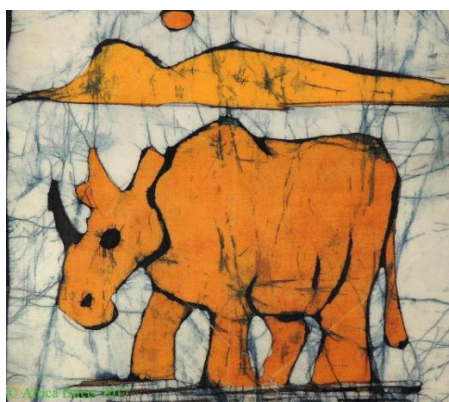
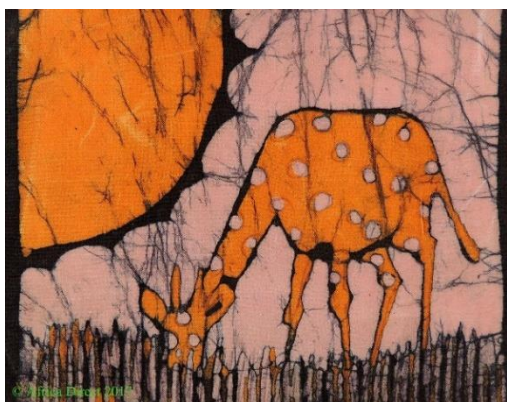

## We are Artists...

This term, the children from year 1 upwards have launched in to their art projects already. They have been finding out about famous artists for inspiration and then creating their own pieces – drafting and critiquing their work as they go so that they can work towards a final piece they can be proud of.

Elm class are learning all about print-making. They are basing their work on the art of William Morris and have already created prints using a range of techniques for example mono-printing (which you can find out more about [here](#) if you would like to have a go at home) and printing by carving in to polystyrene sheets and rolling ink over them. The end results are fantastic so far and we can't wait to see their final pieces.

Maple class have been looking at some African Batik prints and they are going to be creating their own batik prints using hot wax and ink on material. Each child has been working really hard on their design, refining it to make sure it is simple and clear so that it will work well with the batik dye and wax. They have practised already using wax crayons and watercolour and are ready to go for it next week. There are some examples of batik below, which works with the hot wax blocking the dye, for you to see the sort of art they will be aiming for when they work in pairs with Miss Davis next week.



In Oak class, the children are finishing the year by applying all of the skills they have learnt in art over the last few years in a mixed-media piece of their own choosing. They will work with collage and a range of materials to create a piece that is entirely **unique** to them – we can't wait to see what they come up with! We hope that this project gives them the opportunity to truly be artists!

## Material donations needed!

**Do you have any material scraps or old clothes you could donate to Oak Class' art project?! We need lots of different textures, colours and patterns to cut up and sew on so anything you don't want anymore would be much appreciated – the more the merrier! ribbons, wool, fur, patterned material, anything that could make up a fabric collage would be great. Just bring it in to school early next week.**

Once the children are finished with their art, they will then end the year with a design and technology project – this summer's projects are all based around food! They will be creating and designing food and menus for different audiences and getting chance to cook themselves in school.

## How do we teach maths?!

### Parents information session

Following our recent inset day where we looked at the feedback from our parent questionnaire on how we communicate about your childrens' learning, we will be holding a parent information session on Wed 6<sup>th</sup> July at 2.30pm. This session will be a chance for you to hear all about how we teach maths in school from Willow class right up to year 6. We hope that this will help you relate to what your children are doing in school and understand their daily experience so that you can support them and be more informed when discussing their learning with their teacher. We appreciate that not everyone will be able to attend at this time but we plan for these information sessions to become part of life at Whiteshill School and we will repeat them at different times each year so that everyone can benefit as your children move up through the school. We will also upload the presentation to the school website so that you can access it following the session as well.

DEAR STUDENTS, PARENT AND CARERS,
