Changes to Forest School

I have been in discussion with Mr Pritchard on how we run our forest school going forwards. This has come about for a number of reasons, one of which is that we cannot use the woods currently as we are waiting for tree work to be completed. I am pleased to share that we have been able to source funding for this work now so it will be completed as soon as there is availability. We also of course are missing Mrs Clarke, who is forest school trained, so we wanted Mr Pritchard to work with Willow Class at points across the year when possible. Mr Pritchard has long been an advocate for doing forest school on a rota basis as the children get to experience the full range of seasons outside. We also hope that it will be a real treat for them every four weeks rather than being bulked together. A letter will be coming out separately with all the details on Monday and dates for the rest of the year, we will need you to return the permission slips as soon as possible so that we are all set for the year. Thank you.

Just to note as well that unfortunately we will not be able to run our Christmas forest school this year as we are not currently able to use the woods – if this changes, we will of course try and squeeze it in as it is a real highlight of our school calendar!
