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We are curious...our learning this half term

This half term was kicked off with a science week for Elm, Maple and Oak class. They were using their scientific enquiry skills to answer the following questions: Elm class – can we shape glass? Maple class – can I ride my bike in the sand? Oak class – can we make our school more eco-friendly?

As part of their enquiry this term, Oak class took part in the Net Zero Superheroes Competition – organised by AtkinsRealis. Pete Salvin, one of the parents at our school, kindly came in to class with a colleague to introduce the project to the children, setting them the challenge of thinking about what they would design to help the school achieve net zero. They worked together in groups and presented the final ideas in poster form. These will be sent off to compete with other schools. We complete this project every other year with Oak class and last time, one of our teams reached the final so fingers crossed for this year! There were some excellent presentations, with ideas ranging from a wind-turbine powered classroom, through plastic bottle recycled huts to a school eco-bike and plastic-free supports for dyslexic learners! Next up, all 3 classes launched in to their 'we are geographers' projects. Elm class found out about a region of Kenya which included the Masai Mara National Reserve, Maple class found out about the countries of Europe and Oak class found out about North and South America. When you look at a knowledge organiser, you will see that any knowledge coloured green, the children have learnt in a previous class – the new knowledge covered this year is in black. This allows the children to recall the previous knowledge they know already to make links and build on it successfully.
